Surgical Mission 2016







Summary

We are excited to report that from February 25th to March 5th, 2016 The Healing Hands Foundation completed its second annual mission trip to Riobamba, Ecuador. Working with staff at the Hospital de Brigada Galapagos, as well as with local volunteers who provided logistical support, we were able to provide care to Ecuadorians who suffer from healthcare disparity. Indigenous, low-income, and rural households particularly have difficulty accessing the services they need. Our surgical team feels privileged to have met and provided care to these patients.

Surgical Care



Surgeries improve the daily lives of our patients. For instance, after a syndactyly repair (separation of fused fingers) a child's hand becomes fully functional.



Similarly, cleft lip and palate repairs have profound effects: allowing normal speech, enabling good feeding and growth, and preventing social stigma.

We accomplished 52 surgeries on 47 patients.

Ages ranged from 3 months to 55 years.

70 % of our patients were under 18 years old.

Scar revisions
Correction of ear and nose
